- Ian: Now we have Jim and Tyson from Sodexo.
- Speaker:
- -Jim O'Brien & Dan King (10 min)
 - Jim: We came just to let you know what's happening, and hopefully you guys can be our eyes, ears, and voice for the student body.
 - New biggie- Jamba Juice is off to a big start! Dan is not here, he had to drive to Gonzaga for more Jamba products. We are trying to take Mexican food products and eventually have them up and rolling in the grill area- we're trying not to lose the Mexican food. There's a new format in the new addition in Sodexo: the cold Asian station is eliminated. We would like to add Mexican food into the format-Mexican Sundays (baked potato bar, grilled cheese and tomato soup, one day it will be sushi). We want to take advantage of the room to add in something more popular for the students.
 - We're adding two other programs:
 - 1.) Swipe Plus- can come into Saga for \$5 extra or so, have a steak night or a different option to pay a little extra for. (Pay extra to help cover food costs)

- 2.) Crave- maybe in the crow's nest, we will set up a restaurant format. A dorm or group of people can organize a dinner, and could cost the people involved \$5 more and then they can have a catered meal up there. Both of those are fun events to help turn it up a notch.
- Moved two digital screens from the dining area to the coffee shop. This will hopefully help ASWU advertise their programs. All the signs in the food area were not as visible, so hopefully this will help with promoting upcoming ASWU events and activities. Another exciting thing- there is a new sustainability coordinator, Ashton! She met with Tyson today and me a couple days ago, I think you guys picked a great person!
- Tyson is the regional marketing person for Sodexo. He is in charge of a lot, and is here to help us improve at special events and promoting what we do.
- Simple serving- takes care of food allergies that students have. Instead of having special cooking in the back, we can bring it to the front. We would like to make healthy choices easier for people with allergies.
- Tyson: If you have any of these allergies, you currently have to go into the back of the kitchen. We want your dining experience to be the same as any other student, but still be able to avoid the foods with allergies (Milk ,eggs, gluten, wheat soy, shellfish, etc) in the dining hall in the future.
- Jim: One of the things that Tyson brings to the table is that he graduated a few years ago- he brings great experience of a college student.
- Tyson: I've been to 3 colleges. I did marketing for them and did other work with Sodexo and at BYU. Hopefully we can bring some new things to the table and have some fun too. We need your push with the sustainability challenge this year. In the way of sustainability, I don't like to print out a lot of ads. We have moved more toward texting and social media rather than paper.
 - We're starting new program called Pirate dining deals! —It's a text-messaging program to receive VIP information with coupons, (for Swipe plus, for example).
 (Tyson is the only one sending things to students). We will amp up the Facebook page. We have great prizes- ipads, free subs, lattes, smaller items, etc.
 - With facebook and texting, we will interact with the students. Not printing as much to save money, and we can give more free things back this way. If you have anything you'd like to share, come to me or Spencer (student intern). Come talk to us about what you'd like to change.
 - Café takeover night, students can choose recipes and make it your dining hall.

- Changes in Sodexo for this year.
- –Larry Burnley (15 min)-
 - Larry: Assistant VP for diversity, and a professor in the History department. Came to update us about the diversity assessment process and campus climate survey process. Next week is a big week- we will walk through the schedule and talk about these things.
 - Background: The strategic plan calls for Whitworth to do a couple of things related to diversity surveying. (General education requirements of American diversity and global perspectives). Contracted with Rona Halualani to help us do a learning assessment for those courses. The other assessment related initiative has to do with assessing all diversity efforts across the campus as far as effectiveness and impact. Institution of diversity committee—point administrative body that worked with the consultant.
 - O Development and implementation of campus climate survey. We've done surveys in the past that were more focused on international students and underrepresented students. This survey invites the entire community to talk about their experience- wanting to see multiple perspectives how our experience is at Whitworth University and if there are areas where they can grow and improve. Last March they began a data collection process from the faculty staff and students asking them to submit documents as far as diversity

initiatives, etc that we've been engaged in over the past 5 years. They've received tons of information. Whitworth has taken its commitment to diversity, inclusion and equity because it is important to our mission as a university. Last June 6th was the preliminary report on recommendations to make in the final report (made to leaders on campus). Coming back next week to present final report- including their findings and recommendations of the assessment of the diversity mapping process.

- On September 12th, there will be 4 presentations (one came out already on pirate port). In the morning at 8:45 and 10:15 is the diversity mapping presentation (all presentations are in RTT)
- 10:45 = learning outcomes presentation in the RTT.
- O In the afternoon, those will be repeated. Encourage students to participate and be present for this! The findings will be made into a report to submit to the university council. They're shooting for the end of the semester to see how the outcomes we receive from this process can inform and drive advancement of objectives for our goals.
- On September 13th, the consultant has identified some times where they can have some confidential meetings set up.
- Members of the committee have been involved in creating this instrument. The consultant wants to hold focus groups so others can tell them any issues or concerns they believe need to be addressed in the survey instrument itself. There may be concerns, issues or experiences that people don't necessarily want to discuss publicly or be associated with addressing them. These sessions are confidential through appointment at academic affairs, to set up a 20-minute period for individual or small group period. No one from Whitworth would be a part of that other than the ones reporting. That's on Friday.
- The last thing, 7:30-8:30 on Friday morning, consultant wants to meet with ASWU and the CDA's (we decide who we want there)- continental breakfast, located in the chambers. Consultant will talk about survey process. The survey will be administered in third week of October- incentives and prizes (the floor with the most participation gets pizza, etc) will be included. The hope is that everyone has vested interest in the survey itself. This is for the entire community. We want all people to experience this community in the best way.
 - Focus groups: in the conference room and in the chambers Friday morning. Keep a lookout for the announcements, look for the presentations next week and encourage others to attend as well.

- o Cody: Is the way that the survey being advertised just through email?
- Larry: We will develop a communication strategy to get that out effectively, more than just email. Let us know if you have effective suggestions.
- Guest: The upcoming focus groups, could you talk about what they're locking for?
- Larry: They will give you framework for what they want. They won't go through each section, but you'll have an idea of what they might ask. Some people might

- have experiences that are not widely known, and we'd like to give them a safe space to talk about these experiences.
